Members vote to merge

Keystone Conference approved

Conference on November 9, 314
delegates passed the motion requesting
authorization of the UCC General Synod for the four
Pennsylvania Conferences to become one Keystone
Conference. We rejoice with thanksgiving and praise
that the motion was also passed in the other three
Pennsylvania conferences. In fact, the vote for a
Keystone Conference was a resounding yes with voting
of 90 percent or more in each conferences.

That motion will now proceed to the 35th General Synod, set for July 11-15, 2025, in Kansas City, Mo.

We are mindful of voices that spoke in favor of, and in opposition to, the motion and we prayed afterward, "for those who grieve this outcome, who feel disappointed or unheard, that God grant comfort and peace. For those who feel affirmed and joyous excitement, that their hearts be compassionate to those who think and feel differently," so that we might be united by God in love and honor one another fully.

Prior to the vote on the Keystone motion, we discussed, discerned, and decided on a budget for 2025 that will carry us, by your generosity and God's grace, through this final year of our Conference life. Delegates also affirmed the Small Town and Rural (STAR) churches resolution which will also move to the General Synod next year. During our time together we were sustained by Rev. Dwight Hein's devotional which spoke to how whatever the future holds, we will continue to heed Christ's call to be the church in all its many forms by making disciples, helping and sharing with those in need, and loving one another as Christ first loved us.



First, you need to know that we're talking about a real <u>BOX</u>. It will soon be in the auditorium.




- Here's how you can think

Frock Annex gets facade signage

More than 20 years after its completion, the Frock Annex now has a beautiful new sign, highlighting the location of our church offices on Broadway.

Named for E.B. and Becky Frock, the Frock Annex at 130-132 Broadway was dedicated on March 16, 2003, after a year-long renovation and expansion project called "Making Connections."

The project created new space for church offices and added a chapel, seating area, classrooms, a nursery, accessible restrooms, and an entryway from the parking lot. The annex represents an enduring connection between our church's past and future.

Originally built as the home and dental office of Dr. Richard Stock, the pre-Civil War era building was transformed to meet the growing needs of our congregation.

The new sign, crafted by local signmaker Larry Spangler, now stands as a testament to the Frock Annex's legacy and our commitment to serving the community for years to come.

October minutes were approved November 18

Consistory Minutes — October 21

 Treasurer's Report: Motion to accept the Treasurer's Report was made by Bill Wertzberger and seconded by Sean Moore. Approved, subject to audit.

Committee Reports

- More discussion took place regarding organ repair.
 We now have a new letter from Peragallo indicating that we may just want to consider replacing the 12-note wind chest, as it is currently offline, at a cost of \$2,600. The leather is too worn for it to operate effectively. The committee decided to table the discussion on organ repair as the organ has been working fine other than that specific wind chest, which Amy is not in need of using.
- D.E. Wildasin has provided an estimate of \$62,638 to repair the boiler. A down payment will come out of our 2024 funds. The remaining funds will come from 2025 budget. A motion to approve the down payment was made by Sean Moore and seconded by Alec Sivel.

New Business

- Penn Central Conference: Fall Meeting is November 9. Gettysburg Association is also meeting at that same time. Charlotte will attend the Association meeting. Motion was made to have Charlotte represent Emmanuel UCC as our lay delegate by Brian Frederick and seconded by David Jones.
- Employee Compensation Review: Rev. Ken provided insight into employee performance, and then he excused himself from the meeting. Discussion took place on 2025 salary increases. Due to the length of the meeting, the decision was tabled for further consideration.

Missions Committee — November 6


- God's Meal Barrel will provide 100 frozen turkeys, dinner boxes and desserts for Thanksgiving. In October they served 552 people, an increase of 20 compared to last month. They will participate in the Santa's Sleepers and Toys for Tots programs.
- PAL Lunch is encouraging lunch guests to return to eating in the dining room in an effort to ease food waste and the use of disposable dishes.
 Sandy Topper is now volunteering at Meals on Wheels. Emmanuel's next turn for PAL Lunch is Dec. 31. To volunteer, contact Estelle King.
- The membership drive for the Homewood Auxiliary resulted in over 30 new and renewed memberships.
- Donations of Homewood Auxiliary Bingo prizes continue to be collected in a basket in the auditorium. Some new ideas for prizes include chocolate, single-serve snacks, and small stuffed animals. See the Nov. E-Life for more ideas. Bingo prizes will be collected on Dec. 9.
- We will participate in sending Christmas cards to Homewood residents again this year. Missions will provide cards in the auditorium, or you can use your own. Please do not seal the envelopes. For more info, see Peg Moulton.
- Missions agreed to donate \$300 worth of cleaning and hygiene items to New Hope.
- The Fisher House collection, which benefits families of hospitalized vets, resulted in a collection of over \$300. Two quilts, handmade by Marilyn Van Lenten, were blessed at the service, and will be delivered by Marilyn and Estelle King.
- Crafters are currently making twiddlers for residents of Homewood's Memory Care unit.
 They are also making scarves and lap robes, and welcome donations of gloves and mittens.
- Missions agreed to make a \$200 donation to Hanover Against Hunger in memory of Rick Sparacino, who frequently volunteered for church and community efforts. HAH fights hunger both globally and locally.
- The Beyond the Bag Plastics recycling program has gotten off to a good start. We filled one bin, and have started filling a second one.
- The Green Team is also suggesting alternatives to single use water bottles. Members can bring their own water bottles to church events, or they can use the recycled water bottles available at the green table and in the kitchen.
